

How much experience does Madonna TherapyPlus have treating children and adolescents?

Last year, 731 children and adolescents with a variety of diagnoses were served on the Lincoln campus in one or more of the following areas:

- Rehabilitation Day Program (RDP)—an intense, coordinated outpatient program
- Traditional Outpatient (OP)—Physical, Occupational, and/or Speech Therapy 1-3 times per week
- Specialty Clinics and Assessments—specialized services focused on areas such as vision, swallowing, wheelchair mobility, communication or long term follow-up

Madonna TherapyPlus served children and adolescents with brain injury, stroke, spinal cord injury, orthopedic conditions, developmental disabilities and other neurological conditions.



How much therapy will my child or adolescent have?

- Treatment plans are designed to meet individual needs while being mindful of insurance limitations.
- Last year the average number of visits children and adolescents received is as follows:

- Many children and adolescents received recreational therapy, social work services, rehabilitation nursing, neuropsychology and nutrition services as part of their program.

What do other people say about their experience at Madonna TherapyPlus?

- 85% of RDP/OP rated their overall experience as “excellent”.

How will Madonna help my child or adolescent keep up with school?

Last year close to 100 adolescents and children spent time in the Therapeutic Learning Center (TLC). In TLC a certified teacher works with students on their school assignments and with teachers in the student’s home school to make sure the transition back is smooth. In a survey of adolescents and children 6-12 months after discharge, 89% reported being able to return to school in their home communities.

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What happens after my child is discharged?

Many adolescents and children who have had a disabling injury or illness require therapy on an intermittent basis. Information from a telephone survey done 6-12 months after their adolescent or child was discharged from Madonna revealed:

- 94.6% of adolescents and children had made additional functional gains or stayed the same.
- 100% returned to school 6-12 months after discharge.

What kinds of improvements can I expect for my child?

While individual results vary, last year, most adolescents and children were able to take care of themselves, communicate and either walk or use a wheelchair independently with age appropriate supervision. Some required adaptive equipment to help them be independent. The measurable change experienced by patients was above targets as measured by change from admission to discharge on the Functional Assessment Measure (FAM).

Is Madonna accredited?
