



MADONNA (MRH) INPATIENT STROKE PROGRAM OUTCOMES

444

NUMBER OF PEOPLE SERVED

444 people were served by acute rehabilitation, **293** in Omaha and **151** in Lincoln. **173** had left brain strokes, **179** had right brain strokes, **6** had bilateral strokes and the remaining **86** had no paresis or other causes for their stroke.

The average age was **65.3** years old, including **6** children and adolescents.

WHERE PATIENTS COME FROM

Hospitals throughout the United States refer patients with a stroke to Madonna. Last year, more than **27.4%** of stroke patients came from areas outside of Nebraska.

AVERAGE THERAPY HOURS

Last year, people with a stroke had an average of **3.9 hours** of physical, occupational, speech, rehabilitation psychology, and/or recreational therapy per day, five days a week, delivered by licensed therapists.

As appropriate, patients may also receive respiratory and nutrition therapy.

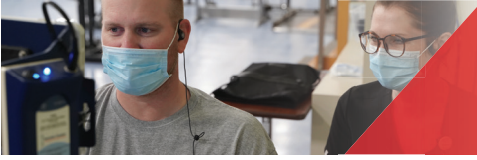
DISCHARGE TO HOME/COMMUNITY

72.8% of people recovering from a stroke at our acute rehabilitation hospitals discharged to a community setting.

PATIENT SATISFACTION

98.6% of people recovering from a stroke rated their overall experience as excellent or good.





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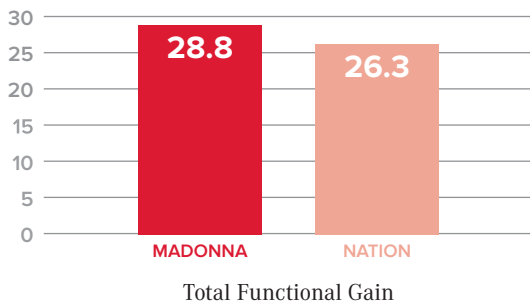
TRANSFERS TO ACUTE

Madonna is a hospital with clinical staff on-site 24 hours a day, seven days per week. Clinical staff are trained to respond to any medical emergency.

Last year, **35** individuals (7.9%) with a stroke transferred to acute care and **31** of those were for unplanned reasons. This is significantly less than other hospitals in the region (9.9%) and nation (10.0%).

INDEPENDENCE LEVEL

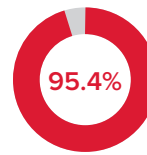
Patients recovering from a stroke at Madonna made greater gains (28.8 points) compared to the nation (26.3 points) as measured by the “Self-Care and Mobility Activities” tool. This progress is calculated by rating activities such as mobility, self-cares, communication and cognition on a scale of 1-6 and totaling the categories.



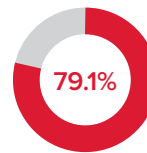
LENGTH OF STAY

Individuals with a stroke stayed at Madonna’s acute rehab an average of **24.3** days.

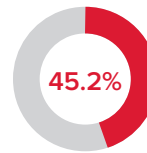
FOLLOW UP 6 MONTHS AFTER DISCHARGE



95.4% of people with a stroke state that they maintained or improved since their discharge in areas such as self-cares, mobility, communication and thinking skills.



79.1% of people with a stroke state that they are able to access the things they need in their community.



45.2% of people with a stroke have returned to work or school.
