



# MADONNA REHABILITATION HOSPITAL OMAHA (MRHO)

Madonna Rehabilitation Hospital Omaha (MRHO) is designed for individuals who require intense medical rehabilitation for a longer period of time than what is provided in the acute care hospital.

The average age was **55.9** years old, including **79** children and adolescents.

Unlike most other rehabilitation settings in Nebraska, MRHO has specific rehabilitation units whose staff are experts in care for persons with brain injury, stroke and for adolescents and children. Physicians, rehabilitation nurses, and therapists who are assigned to these units are experts in treating people with these diagnoses.

## AVERAGE THERAPY HOURS

Last year, people served in MRHO averaged **3.5 hours** of physical, occupational, speech, rehabilitation psychology, and/or recreation therapy every day. Only licensed therapists provide this therapy. You may also receive respiratory and nutrition therapy.

## LENGTH OF STAY

Patients at MRHO stayed an average of **21** days.

## PATIENT SATISFACTION

**98%** of patients rated their overall experience as excellent or good and **90%** said they would definitely recommend MRHO to family or friends.



## WHERE PATIENTS COME FROM

Last year, more than **28%** of patients were admitted to MRHO from hospitals outside of Nebraska.



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## HOW OFTEN WILL I SEE A DOCTOR

You will be seen several days per week by a physiatrist, a doctor who specializes in rehabilitation, and as needed by physicians with other specialties such as internal medicine, pulmonary and others.

Physicians are on call 24 hours per day, seven days per week, but may not be present in the hospital at all times. If your attending physician is not immediately available, the physician on call will be contacted. The available physician will provide assessment of any changing or emergent situation and provide medical direction for care and treatment either in person or by telephone. If the emergent situation requires care that cannot be provided at Madonna, you will be transferred to an acute care hospital.

## TRANSFERS TO ACUTE

Madonna is a licensed hospital with nurses onsite 24 hours a day, seven days per week. All clinical staff are trained to respond to any medical emergency. Patients may be sent to a local emergency room if they have a sudden change in condition. Some patients may be scheduled to go back to a local hospital for further surgery or other specialty care.

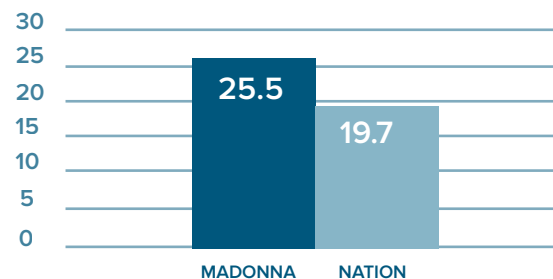
Last year **11%** of patients returned to acute care for planned and unplanned procedures including things like additional surgery or treatment for acute medical conditions.

## DISCHARGE TO HOME/ COMMUNITY

**73%** were discharged to their home, a relative or friend's home, or to some place supportive like an assisted living or retirement community.

## INDEPENDENCE LEVEL

Patients in MRHO made higher functional gains in areas such as mobility, self cares, communication and cognition than the nation and discharged at a higher functional level overall (91.7 vs. 85 total points).

## ACCREDITATION

MRHO has accreditation from CARF International as a comprehensive integrated inpatient program, brain injury specialty program, stroke specialty program and pediatric specialty program.

Additionally, MRHO was certified by the Joint Commission in 2016. This certification means that our hospital meets very high standards for safety and quality care for patients.
