

MADONNA (MRH) INPATIENT BRAIN INJURY PROGRAM OUTCOMES

441 NUMBER OF ADMISSIONS

343 persons were served by acute rehabilitation, **164** in Omaha and **179** in Lincoln. **265** (66%) had traumatic brain injury and the remaining **134** (34%) had a non-traumatic brain injury such as encephalitis, infection or brain tumor.

The average age was **42.9** years old, including 66 children and adolescents.

WHERE PATIENTS COME FROM

Hospitals throughout the Midwest refer patients with brain injury to Madonna. Last year, more than **50%** of patients with brain injury came from areas outside of Nebraska.

AVERAGE THERAPY HOURS

Last year, persons with brain injury on our acute rehabilitation units had an average of **3.5 hours** of physical, occupational, speech, rehabilitation psychology, and/or recreation therapy per day, 5 days a week, delivered by licensed therapists.

As appropriate, you may also receive respiratory and nutrition therapy as well.

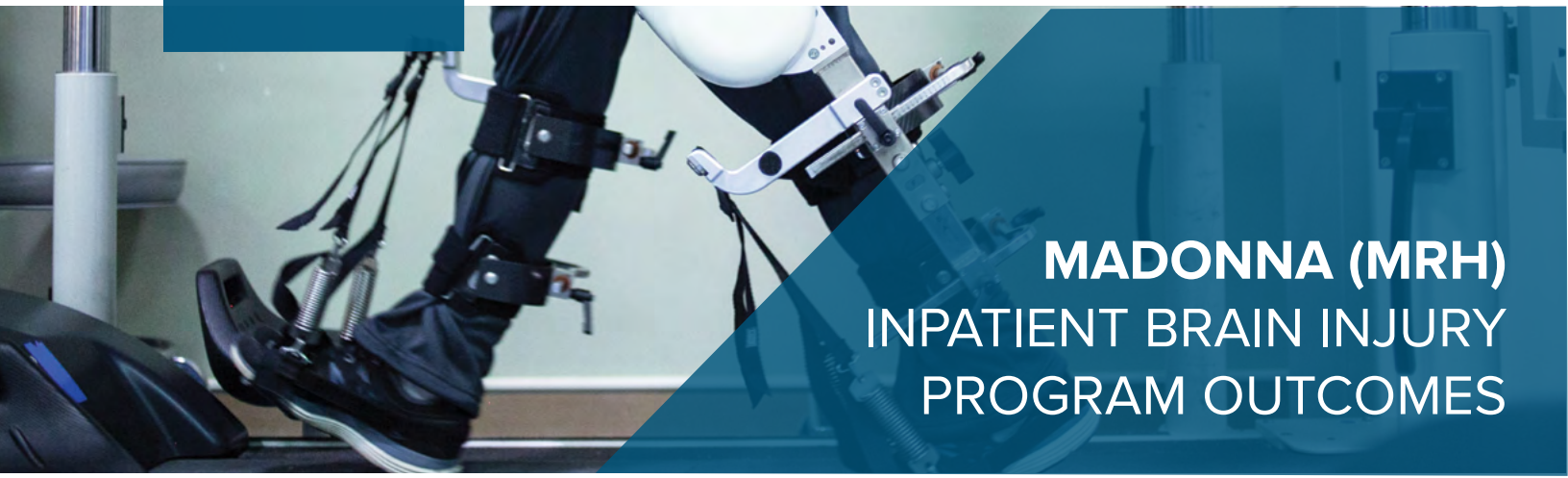
DISCHARGE TO HOME/COMMUNITY

72.9% of acute rehab patients were discharged to a community setting, exceeding other hospitals in the nation (71.7%).

PATIENT SATISFACTION

97.3% of patients with brain injury rated their overall experience as excellent or good.





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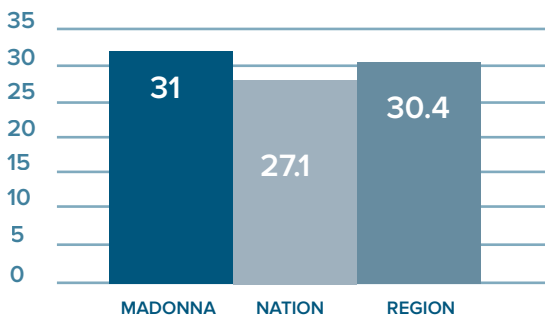
TRANSFERS TO ACUTE

Madonna is a hospital with clinical staff on-site 24 hours a day, seven days per week. Clinical staff are trained to respond to any medical emergency. Individuals may return to acute care if their status warrants a transfer or for a planned procedure.

Last year **16.7** percent of acute rehabilitation patients with brain injury returned to the hospital for either planned or unplanned reasons.

INDEPENDENCE LEVEL

Patients with brain injury in Madonna's acute rehab program made more progress toward independently being able to do activities such as walking, taking care of themselves, communicating and thinking than at other regional and national facilities. Improvement is measured using the Functional Independence Measure (FIM) which includes these activities, each rated on a 1-7 scale and totaled.

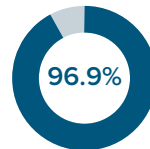


Total FIM Gain

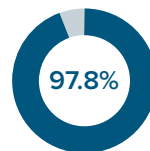
LENGTH OF STAY

Individuals with brain injury stayed at Madonna's acute rehab an average of **30** days.

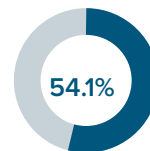
FOLLOW UP AT 6 MONTHS AFTER DISCHARGE



96.9% of persons with brain injury state that they maintained or improved since their discharge in areas such as self-cares, mobility, communication and thinking skills.



97.8% of persons with brain injury state that they are able to access the things they need in their community.



54.1% of persons with brain injury have returned to work or school.
