



MADONNA (MRH) INPATIENT CANCER PROGRAM OUTCOMES

223 NUMBER OF PEOPLE SERVED

124 people were served by acute rehabilitation, **93** in Omaha and **31** in Lincoln. **99** people were served by specialty rehabilitation, **71** in Omaha and **28** in Lincoln. **30** persons with cancer from Omaha were admitted for a non-neurological reason and **1** person from Lincoln.

The following data is taken from Omaha acute rehabilitation only:

The average age was **63.7** years old, including **2** children and adolescents.

WHERE PATIENTS COME FROM

Hospitals throughout the region refer patients with cancer to Madonna. Last year, **28%** of patients' permanent residences were outside the Omaha and Lincoln metro.

AVERAGE THERAPY HOURS

Last year, people with cancer had an average of **3.5 hours** of physical, occupational, speech, rehabilitation psychology, and/or recreation therapy 5 days a week, delivered by licensed therapists.

As appropriate, patients may also receive respiratory and nutrition therapy.

DISCHARGE TO HOME/ASSISTED LIVING

73% of people with cancer at our acute rehabilitation hospital in Omaha discharged to home or to an assisted living facility.

PATIENT SATISFACTION

100% of people with cancer rated their overall experience as excellent or good.





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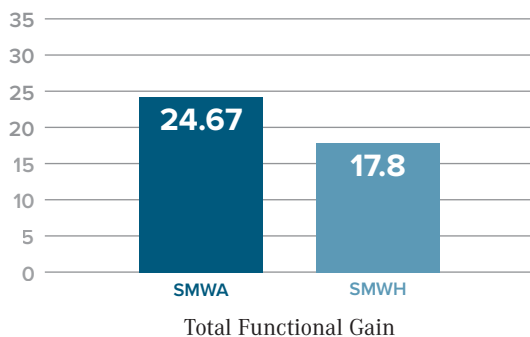
TRANSFERS TO ACUTE

Madonna is a hospital with clinical staff on-site 24 hours a day, seven days per week. Clinical staff are trained to respond to any medical emergency.

Last year **20.4%** of acute rehabilitation patients with cancer returned to the hospital for either planned – such as additional treatment – or unplanned reasons. Unplanned returns to acute hospitals accounted for only **11.8%** last year.

INDEPENDENCE LEVEL

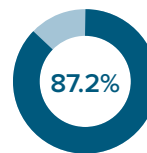
Patients with cancer at Madonna made gains as measured by the “Self-Care and Mobility Activities” tool. This progress is calculated by rating activities such as mobility, self-cares, communication and cognition on a scale of 1-6 and totaling the categories. We report this data in two categories: self-care/mobility/walk (SMWa) and self-care/mobility/wheelchair (SMWh).



LENGTH OF STAY

Individuals with cancer stayed at Madonna’s acute rehab an average of **15.4** days.

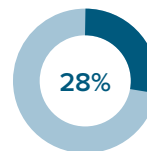
FOLLOW UP AT 30 DAYS AFTER DISCHARGE



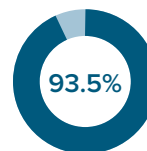
87.2% of people with cancer state that they maintained or improved since their discharge in areas such as self-cares, mobility and communication.



92.3% of people with cancer state they have seen their primary care physician and/or oncologist since discharge.



28% of people with cancer have returned to work or school.



93.5% of people with cancer state they have returned to activities or hobbies since discharge.

ACCREDITATION

Madonna Rehabilitation Hospitals are accredited by CARF, the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, as an Inpatient Medical Rehabilitation Program and Cancer Specialty Program for adults and pediatrics in Omaha.
