Fast Facts FAQs July 1, 2016–June 30, 2017

Description: Madonna Rehabilitation Specialty Hospital-Lincoln (MRSH-Lincoln) is appropriate for individuals who require intense medical management for a longer period of time than generally occurs in the acute care hospital. Unlike most specialty hospitals, Madonna has chosen to apply a rehabilitation approach to care for the individuals served.

How much experience does MRSH-Lincoln have treating people like me?

- Last year, MRSH-Lincoln served 489 persons.
- The average age was 62 years old.
- Diagnoses included the following:
 - Brain Injury—81
 - Stroke—151
 - Spinal Cord Injury—67
 - Pulmonary Conditions—158
 - Cardiac—19
 - Wounds—106
 - Other Medical Conditions—329

Where do people come from?

Hospitals throughout the region and nation refer patients to MRSH-Lincoln.

How much therapy will I have?

- Last year, patients served at MRSH-Lincoln had an average two hours of physical, occupational, speech therapy and/or psychology per day delivered by licensed therapists.
- In addition to therapies, patients receive skilled rehabilitation nursing care 24 hours per day, seven days per week.
- As appropriate, you may also receive respiratory, recreation and nutrition therapy.

How often will I see a doctor?

You will be seen daily by a hospitalist physician, and as needed by physicians who specialize in Rehabilitation, Pulmonology, Neurology, Wound Care or other specialty areas.

I have other medical problems. What happens if I get sick or have a medical emergency?

- Madonna is a hospital with clinical staff on-site 24 hours a day, seven days per week.
- Last year 83 patients (16.9%) had unplanned returns to acute care. Most of these returned to MRSH-L to complete their program.
- According to the latest Medicare data, MRSH-Lincoln is in the top 0.8% of long term acute care hospitals in the U.S. for preventing readmissions to acute care within 30 days of discharge.

How long will I be at Madonna?

Individuals stayed at MRSH-Lincoln an average of 32 days last year.

What kinds of outcomes can I expect?

- 48% discharged to a home setting or to an acute rehabilitation hospital to continue their recovery. This is greater than the regional benchmark of 42%.
- 66% of those who were admitted on a mechanical ventilator weaned in an average of 14.7 days.

What do other people say about their experience at MRSH-Lincoln?

- 80% of patients rated their overall experience as 9 or 10 on a 10 point scale.
- 90% said they would “definitely” recommend MRSH-L to family or friends.

Is Madonna accredited?

Yes, by CARF, the Rehabilitation Accreditation Commission. In April 2015, Madonna earned the highest accreditation level possible – three years – as a Comprehensive Integrated Inpatient Rehabilitation Program, Stroke Specialty Program, Brain Injury Specialty Program and Spinal Cord System of Care.
