How much experience does Madonna have treating people like me?

During the inaugural 6 months at the Omaha campus there were 27 pediatric admissions to in patient acute rehabilitation.

- That same 6 months, Madonna Omaha discharged 25 inpatients from the children and adolescent pediatric unit.
- Overall the average age at discharge was 11.1 years of age. The chart below shows how many children were discharged when grouped by age.

Does Madonna have a separate area for children and adolescents?

Madonna has a dedicated rehabilitation unit for adolescents and children, the physicians, nurses and therapists who work on the pediatric team have special competencies in treating adolescents and children following illness or acquired injury.

Where do families come from?

Hospitals throughout the Midwest refer adolescents and children to Madonna. During our first 6 months of operation 10% of those admitted to the Omaha campus traveled from outside the Omaha metro area in search of the unique setting and expertise in rehabilitation we provide.



How much therapy will my child have?

Last year, children and adolescents served had an average of 3.5 hours of physical, occupational, speech, psychology, and/or recreational therapy per day delivered by licensed therapists. As appropriate, your child may also receive respiratory therapy, nutrition therapy or support from the therapeutic learning center.

How long will my child be at Madonna?

Last year patients and families stayed on average 32 days at the Omaha campus.

How often will my child see a doctor?

Your child will be seen regularly by Dr. Bierner, a psychiatrist who specializes in rehabilitation. Your admitting physician will be pediatric hospitalists Dr. Snow, Dr. Stoolman or Dr. Snyder and as needed by physicians with other medical specialties.

My child has other medical problems. What happens if he/she gets sick or has a medical emergency?

- The doctors and nursing staff will monitor your child's medical condition. Madonna has on-site laboratory and radiology services. Most tests are available should your child need them, with results in less than 24 hours.
- Medical staff is available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, with Pediatric Advanced Life Support certification, and the equipment and processes in place to respond to medical emergencies.
- Last year, 12% of the adolescents and children served had an unplanned return to acute care. Most were able to return to Madonna to complete their rehabilitation program and return home.



What kinds of outcomes can I expect?

- 81% of children/adolescents met their predicted outcomes at discharge.
- 84% were discharged to a community setting.
- Average change from admission to discharge based on FIM assessment scores changed an average 40 points.
- Children/adolescents participate in school re-entry activities, utilizing Madonna's Therapeutic Learning Center.

What do other people say about their experience at Madonna?

- 100% of patients rated their overall experience as excellent or good.
- 100% said they would "definitely" recommend Madonna to family or friends.
