

## Transitional Care Unit Fast Facts FAQs July 1, 2015–June 30, 2016

### How much experience does St. Jane de Chantal have treating people like me?

- Last year, St. Jane de Chantal served 312 persons in our Transitional Care Unit (TCU).
- Diagnoses included the following:
  - Brain Injury—15
  - Spinal Cord Injury—12
  - Stroke—21
  - Neurological Conditions—1
  - Orthopedic Conditions—112
  - Pulmonary—22
  - Wounds—7
  - Other Medical—122

### Where do people come from?

Most of the patients served in the TCU are admitted from local hospitals with a small percentage from Omaha or other regional hospitals.

### How much therapy will I have?

- Last year, people served in the TCU had an average two hours of physical, occupational and/or speech therapy per day delivered by licensed therapists.
- As appropriate, you may also receive psychology, respiratory and nutrition therapy. Recreational activities are available to those who choose to participate.

### How often will I see a doctor?

You will be seen by an internal medicine physician at least twice during your stay; more often if there is a need. Other specialties, such as orthopedics, Pulmonology, wound or others are also available if you need them.

### I have other medical problems. What happens if I get sick or have a medical emergency?

- St. Jane de Chantal is a hospital with clinical staff on-site 24 hours a day, 7 days per week.
- Last year 22 patients (7.05%) had unplanned returns to acute care. Most were able to return to St. Jane de Chantal to finish their program.

### How long will I be at St. Jane de Chantal?

Last year, individuals stayed an average of 21.12 days in the TCU.

### What kinds of outcomes can I expect?

- While individual results vary, 209 individuals (91.1%) met their predicted outcomes at discharge.
- 80.8% were discharged to a community setting, which is greater than the target of 75%.

### What do other people say about their experience at St. Jane de Chantal?

- 95% of patients rated their overall experience as excellent or good.
- 92% said they would “definitely” recommend St. Jane de Chantal to family or friends.

### Is St. Jane de Chantal accredited?

Yes, Madonna St. Jane de Chantal Long Term Care is the only Skilled Nursing Facility in Nebraska to be accredited by CARF, the Rehabilitation Accreditation Commission, as a Comprehensive Integrated Inpatient Program.
